

the house left containing six acres hanging on the south side the house
toll of George Mummings & on the north side the highway
leading to the common swamps

Also sixteen acres of upland on the north side containing to a
parcell of land of Thomas Moxon the south side to a
parcell of land of George Mummings

Also thirty four acres of upland lying on the west side of the river
upon north hill hanging a piece of land of Thomas pondleton
on the south side and John Hayme on the north side

Also thirty seven acres of upland hanging a piece of inland
meadows on the north side and a piece of upland of Thomas
Moxon on the south side also three acres abounding

Also thirteen acres and a half of meadows butting against the
dwelling house of the said Walter Hayme at the east end hanging
a piece of meadow on the south side laid out to George Mummings
on the north side at the west end of the meadow the side of it lying
to a piece of meadows of George Mummings at the other end by the
north side a piece of meadows laid out for Mr. Walsgrave the
west end it self butts to the thirty acres of upland abovesaid
running out the river from one end to the other

Also twenty nine acres and a half of meadows hanging on the
south side the abovesaid piece of meadow laid out to George Mummings
on the north side a piece of meadows belonging to Thomas Moxon
on the east end it butts to the river and the west end to upland

Also ten acres of meadows late in the possession of John Inghet now
belonging exchanged with Thomas Croxst and it bounded with a piece
of meadow of William Warden late in the possession of Richard
whyte on the south side and to the meadows of Nathaniel Creden
on the north side and ^{with} the river at the west end butts to
upland

Memorandum that all the severall parcell of upland ^{and meadows}
granted to the said Walter Hayme be they more or less without
contradiction.

1644 The town and gate granted liberty to Walter Haine to have one ten
acres of meadow being a part of the ground division of Meadon
lies on the west side of the river and to take up for it ten acres
of meadow lying on the west side of the river more to the west
side of the town bounded with said meadow with ^{the} river and by
a gill of upland that lies with the said meadow with ten acres of
part of the said meadow ground under the gill. The meadow is cal
led by the name of Figg Meadon.

21 December 14 1466 It is agreed between Walter Haine of Sundry &
Thomas King of the said Walter Haine that for ever possess & enjoy
four acres of meadow lying on the west side of the river in the great
river meadows lying between the said meadows and the said Walter Haine
of that the said Thomas King shall for ever possess and
