

the land of David Haynes

June the 10 : 1703 at a proprietors Meeting they Chose a Committee who were
Evan John Goodnow, John Groat which Committee are to go and view a piece
of land that David Haynes desires to have confirmed to him and so to now
mark the bounds thereof and so to have it recorded which piece of land was
taken up for an acre and half of Meadow layd down at the Glades

June the tenth 1703 John Goodnow and John Groat being
Chosen and appointed a Committee to settle the bounds of a small tract
of land which the proprietors ordered him to take up in land of
an acre and half of meadow layd down at Pine Glades Meadow: for
the use of the proprietors: And the said Committee have been upon
the Spot and have layd out two small Strips of land adjoining to his
land formerly belonging to his father Deacon John Haynes now in the
possession of sd David Haynes: the land was hand butted and bounded
as followeth to wit: the South west Corner beginneth with a stake by a
small ~~marked~~ ^{marked} tree: thence a strait line to a white oak marked: from thence
a strait line to a Clefted Tree and a Red oak marked by it: Next a gray
oak Crooked marked next a Red oak marked next a greater gray oak
marked: and then turning the Northwest Corner angle a black oak
marked for a Corner Mark: thence to a black oak marked then to a black
oak marked then to a white oak marked thence a strait line
to a ~~Walnut~~ ^{Walnut} tree: which ~~tree~~ ^{was} the old Corner Mark between
Deacon John Haynes and Thomas Plymton Sons divided and by them
Thomas and Peter Plymton who were then upon the Spot present
and owned and marked the Walnut tree in our presence:
the said land was be it more or less was Excepted by sd David Haynes
in full satisfaction for what meadow his father layd down at
Pine Meadow Glades
