

his house lott four acres haungt the house lott of Edmund Goodenow on the south side and the house lott of Thomas Hlyn on the north side Also an acre and a half of upland upon the south side of the house lott of Edmund Goodenow and a half of upland in the flatti betwene the timber necke and in the flatti betwene the house lott of Edmund Goodenow on the north east side and the land of John Maynard on the south west side

Also ten acres of upland lyng on the west side of the River on north hill haungt the land of Walter Haymer on the south side and the land of Edmund Goodenow on the north side

Also two acres and a half of meadow lyng betwene the meadow of Edmund Goodenow on the south side and the meadow of Thomas Hlyn on the north side

Also five acres and a half of meadow in the lower meadows lyng betwene the meadow of John Wood on the south side and the meadow of William Browne on the north side

1643. John Laine bought of Thomas Hlyn one acre and a half of upland be the same more or less lyng betwene the land of the said John Laine, joyning to his now dwelling house the land of the said John Laine.

1644. John Laine bought of Edmund Goodenow a parcell of upland containing by estimation eight Acres or there about betwene the same more or less lyng on the west side of the River betwene the land of the said John Laine the land of the said Edmund Goodenow.

1646. Granted to John Haymer 4 acres of upland lyng southerly to ye Highe way, southerly to ye land of Thomas Roy. Also 5 acres of Meadow lyng in ye gutter betwene the meadow of John Standford and the Peter Noyde. Also one acre of Meadow beyond pasture meadow, adjoynt to ye meadows of Hugh Griffin. where of the meadow was yet of his father's hand division of meadow.

Also granted and layd out unto John Gaine in the year 1648 one hundred and thirty acres of land be it more or less in the two miles left granted by Town of Sudbury being the six and fortyth lot and lyng in the fourth and last square room having the land of Thomas Colyton on the north and the land of John Noyde on the south being bounded at the west end by the meadows and bounded on the east end by the middle highway, and the said square room
