

his house lott four & arres be the same more or less adjoining to the house lott of Thomas whyte on the north side and to the house lott of John how on the south side

Also four arres of upland be the same more or less parted from the foresaid house lott by the high way and adjoining on the north side to the land of Thomas whyte and to the river on the south side

Also twenty arres of upland be the same more or less commonly called & known by the name of gravel pitte the south side lying between the playne and the north side to a parcel of land once granted to John Knight running westerly to a piece of meadow w^{ch} is joined to the land of Mathamell (roadway) and John (stone) the north side bounded with a cartpath and a white gate p^{er}ts to the meadows of Thomas Brown

Also two arres of meadow be the same more or less lying in the great meadow buttmg in the south side to the meadow of John how and on the north side to the meadow of Thomas white at the west end adjoining to a piece of meadow of Bryan & Endleton also an arres & half for allivant

Also five arres of meadow be the same more or less lying at gravel pitte next adjoining to his foresaid twenty arres of upland w^{ch} said meadow is divided by a white callyerow on either side of the meadow the lynd runninge across the meadow from end to end to the other

1646. Granted to Hugh Griffyn 5 acres ~~of~~ of meadow lying in a great river meadow on the west side of the river joining to his meadow of the river Curtis. Also a piece of meadow containing by estimation 2 acres & half for the same more or less lying in a piece of meadow running northward from the house of John Endleton running to a little woody swamp northward also an arres. Also a piece of meadow containing by estimation one acre & thereabout for the same more or less lying on the both sides of the brook a little southward from the cart-path going over the brook to the meadow called hopy meadow here

January 21st 1644 It is agreed by the towne that whereas Hugh Griffyn had formerly granted five arres of meadow next adjoining to his addition of upland at gravel pitte that parcell beinge received and growinge more in quantity then his five arres it is granted that hee shall hold it all without contradiction bee it more or less lyinge betweene the foresaid upland at gravel pitte & the meadow layd out to John Moore. Beinge bounded w^{ch} a white Gate on east side of the meadow w^{ch} p^{er}ts of meadow containe in all 8 arres and is his second division of meadow.

Also granted that layd out to Hugh Griffyn 15 acres in the year 1643 one garden and thirty arres of land be it more or less in the towne late granted the town of Sudbury beinge the township bet and the in the town of Sudbury havinge his land of John Smith on the west and the lands of Henry (his) on the south butting on the west on the widdowes and butting on the east on the widdowes and the second square
