

Middlesex so October 25^m 1776

Whereas Capt. Cor^s Wood of Sudbury, has complained to us William Barker and Sam^l Knight, two of the fence viewers of the Town of Sudbury, and says, that M^r Jonas Holden Gent^m whose Land adjoines to his neglects to repair his fence, and first repaired to S^r Woods Meadow Called allowance Meadow adjoines to S^r Holdens Land and meadow, and finding S^r Holdens part of fence being the Easterly part to be verry deficient he promised to make the same directly

2^d by repairing to S^r Woods Land adjoining to S^r Holdens Horse Lot, whose Neglects to repair his fence a disputes arising which part of fence he should do, Then went on the line S^r Lines and made the following division as by Law we were impowered, and began at M^r James Thompsons House by the Great Road Easterly, and Measured the same, and found it to be Seventy Rods on the Easterly end of S^r Line which is M^r Jonas Holdens part or Share of said fence, and the westerly end to Capt Wood part which is Seventy Rods, which is Each ones part to erect and maintain for ever hereafter. And in setting off S^r ^{fence} ~~S^r~~ ^{S^r} Twenty four Rods of Ditch which S^r Woods Comes as his property, which we valued at Twelve Shillings
