

his house lott fourd acres be the same more or less buttynge upon the
great meadow upon the east end of it. John Hayme lymge upon the
northside of it and John Coll upon the southside of it
Also six acres lymge upon the northside of the River havinge the
great meadow upon the east side of it and the hill ^{up} on the westside
of it the northend of it runninge against a hill at the west end of
the meadow of the said Edmond Goodnow and the southend of it
against goodman Bent.

Also twelved acres of upland be the same more or less lymge on the
west side of the river upon rocky hill John Hayme on the south side
and John Goodnow on the northside of it

Also ten acres and a halfe of upland be the same more or less
lymge upon the flatte on the east side of the River between tymber
mills of m^r Blouet farmer. havinge John Bent on the northside
of it and Robert Darrell on the south side and the west end of it upon
the river

Also five acres and a halfe of meadow be the same more or less
lymge in the great meadow havinge John Hayme on the northside
of the meadow reserved for a minister on the south side of it the eastend
of it buttynge against the west end of the house lott of Robert Darrell

Also eight acres of meadow beinge a pte of his second addition of
meadow be the same more or less lymge on the east side of the
towne havinge waterstonde lymge on the east side of it the south
end and westside buttynge upon the Common and the north end of
it against goodmores wille.

Also three acres of meadow be the same more or less beinge the other
part of his second addition of meadow lymge upon the head of a stream
beinge compassed easterly westerly & southerly to the town common
and the northend of it against Robert Beest a small wille on the
east of the meadow beinge the bounde betwene them.

643 Edmund Goodnow bought of Thomas & John a parcell of meadow lying in
the great River meadow. containing by estimation one acre or thereabout be
the same more or less, lying betwene the meadow of John Hayme & John
Lokar, w^{ch} all right in tenureage belonging to the same.

14/1644 Granted to Edmund Goodnow twelve acres of upland lying upon the
bounde on the east side w^{ch} land of Edmund Goodnow upon the west side to the
land of William Koclay formerly granted to m^r Goodnow.

Also one acre of upland be the same more or less lying between
the land of John Hayme & the land of John Coll, parted by the
way from the house of the said Edmund.

It is agreed betwene Edmund Goodnow & John Hayme that the
said Edmund shall for ever enjoy all the meadow of the said John
Hayme lying upon the westside of the River being a part of the first
addition of meadow granted to the said John Hayme, w^{ch} said parcell of
meadow had betwene the meadow formerly granted to Edmund Goodnow
now on the one side of the meadow of Thomas & John on the other side. In
consideration w^{ch} of the said John Hayme shall for ever enjoy one acre
betwene the meadow upon the east side of the River w^{ch} said parcell of
meadow the said Edmund bought of Thomas & John & the bounde of the
meadow.
