June the 8th. Edmund Goodnow & William Kerley senior gave & =
conveyed for ever all parcels of land & tenements (vizt) the said
Edmund gave & delivered unto the said William Kerley a parcel
of upland containing by estimation fifteen acres of land
situate about lying on the west side of the river & to the said
meadowes less five acres & more of the same ground to the said
Edmund, these acres more of the said parcel the said Edmund bought
of the said Joke Bant; the remainder was a part of the said Ed-
mund's lands addition of upland; & also one parcel of meadow con-
taining five acres or thereabouts to the said more or less lying
on the west side of the river in the great river meadow w^{ch} said
meadow was a part of the said Edmund's first division of meadow
part of Joke Hamlet first division of meadow, & part of
the said Joke's first division of meadow, & part of a meadow
that was laid out for a Minister's lot w^{ch} parcel the said Ed-
mund bought of the town. In consideration w^{ch} of the
said William Kerley gave & delivered unto the said Edmund
Goodnow a parcel of upland by estimation four acres or
thereabouts, being the couplet granted to Joseph Cantor. Also
two acres of upland lying upon the plain being part
of a parcel of upland formerly granted to Mr. Hoordam &
sold to the land of the said Edmund Goodnow. Also a parcel of me-
dow containing by estimation five acres or thereabouts to the
said more or less lying in the great river meadow, being of
the south side of the meadow, of the river & ground cross the
river from the one side of the meadow to the other being the second
division granted to Joseph Cantor, w^{ch} parcel of upland
granted to Joseph Cantor & Mr. Hoordam bought of Joseph Cantor
or his heirs with William Kerley. And the two acres of upland lying upon
the plain the town granted to Mr. Hoordam & Mr. Hoordam
sold to the said William Kerley.

Edmund Goodnow bought of Joke Hamlet six couplets & couple lying
between the couplet of the said Edmund & the couplet of Thomas
Joke; & also five acres of upland adjoining to the couplet of
the said Joke Hamlet lying between the land of the
said Edmund Goodnow & a piece of way. & also that part
of the land of Joke Lohar, of the parcel of land one acre
or thereabouts the said Joke Hamlet bought of Thomas Joke
granted to Edmund Goodnow & acres of upland & acres thereof lying on the north
side of the long hill adjoining to the common swamp & also two acres
lying in the south pt of the town being adjoining to acres of
upland of the widow Calton having the widow Calton's lands on the
south side of it & on the north side of it adjoining to 2 acres of
upland of John Cuddeley & part of land of the said John Cuddeley
the said Joke Hamlet gave & delivered unto the said Edmund Goodnow & now in the possession of the
said Edmund Goodnow. Also granted to Edmund Goodnow a acre of
meadow lying in the great river meadow now adjoining to the river
from the north side of the river. And the said Joke Hamlet was the 2^d division w^{ch}
said Joke Hamlet & Joke Hamlet the said Edmund Goodnow bought of
William Kerley & is now in possession of Edmund Goodnow the 3^d division
