Also granted and layd out to lieutenant Edmond Goodenow in ye years 1663
one hundred and thirty acres of land in ye two miles last granted to
town of Sudbury being ye obventy lot in the first square
lying to the lands of Robert Davis ye heirs on the north
and ye lands of Herbert Gylman Esquire on the south butting
on the east on the high way by the roads wide and the five miles
first granted to town of Sudbury and butch on the west
on the middle high way and fourth and fifth west of the town

Also layd out unto lieutenant Edmond Goodenow in ye years 1663
twenty eight acres of upland be it more or less by and with the
consent of the town of Sudbury on the west side of Sudbury river
having the lands of m^r Joseph noyes on the east and adjoining to a high
way five rods wide on the south, where the high way partly the upland and
a madow of the said lieutenant Goodenow sommonly called and known
by the name of the west madow also bounded on the west side by a common
spine hill also bounded on the east side by the high way rising leaden from
Sudbury unto the new mill that is to say at the north west angle
and so running under the hill as the trees are marked unto the lands
of the said Joseph noyes ten acres of the said land was purchased
of m^r William Brown and also nine acres of the said land was
purchased of John Gormanton of Sudbury Taverne and also nine
acres was purchased of John maine of Sudbury all where the said
lands were long since stated unto the said persons and returned
unto him but now sold unto the said lieutenant Goodenow and
his heirs for ever by him the said brown Gormanton and maine

Also granted
Also layd out unto lieutenant Goodenow the 14th of June in ye years 1664 eight
acres of land be it more or less according to the grant of the town of Sudbury
in atown meetings warned for the purpose that is to say layd the high way out
at the west madow being between the madow and the upland of the said lieutenant
Goodenow as also layd out the residue of the said eight acres of land unto the
said lieutenant Goodenow at the west ward end of twenty eight acres of upland
purchased of m^r will brown John maine and John Gormanton of Sudbury.
The fourth west angle being a white oak marked by a line from Court way at the
corner and of lieutenant west madow and from there a line cross the river
to the corner or angle of land formerly unto the said lieutenant Goodenow
all where the said eight acres of land was purchased of William Brown and stated
unto the said lieutenant Goodenow in full view by the town of Sudbury
