unto his flos meadow which lyeth northerly of it at what the land
was formerly granted unto John moord on the nor west
and every way else but on the Common lands of Sudbury
the south east line is abt. lme because of leaving away for the north
to pass with a cart down the hill which said fiftion acres of land
was it more or less was laid out and stated by the town
survourers Capt Edmund Goodenow and Lout John Groat to be
for ever the said John Goodenow his heirs and Successors
for ever In Consideration whereof of the said John Goodenow
Hath surrendered up unto the town fiftion acres of Land lying
and being nor west side of a hill commonly known and called
by the name of Goodmans Hill which land the said John xxv
Goodenow Bought of Doctor John Hains as by deed will appear
having the lands of the Doctor noysd on the south west goodmans hill
on the south east the lands that was formerly Thomas Plimptons on
the north and town land on the nor west the said fiftion acres of
land be it more or less the said John Goodenow doth give in
and is to remain for ever to the town the disposal

Granted to John Goodenow by the town of Sudbury the first of march 1681 500
acres of ord. folio 113 to Chaney a small part of land red for red. with the town
and Lout John Groat on the 10th and twelfth day of may 1688 and by the
on the east side of the hill behind the now dwelling house of Edmund Goodenow
and joyned to the nor west end of the said John Goodenows own land that
the high way on the nor west side of the land that is taken up by the said Goodenow
and is butted and bounded as followeth: the westerly corner is a road ork by the
side of a Swamp where is marked Southwady and runs away to a mark on the
south side of the Swamp and the road oare tree is marked Easterly and from
thence runneth up to the side of the hill behind the house of Edmund Goodenow and
land hath a wallnut tree marked and from that wallnut tree runs to a wallnut
road ork marked and from thence to the western corner of the Cow house
and thence poroids: the land contains by estimation half an acre or there about
more or less and is to remain the said John Goodenow and his heirs Successors for
ever and the said John Goodenow in full ther of hath layd down and relinquished
500 more land red for red on the westerly corner of his foild next Benjamin
Woods where said lands to be at the towns disposal for ever
