Also three acres and a halfe of meadow in the great meadow ^{in the great meadow} John Lokers on the southside and Robert Darville meadow on the northside

Also seven acres and a halfe of meadow to the same more or lesse lying the southend to pynne brade rayning to the meadow of Edmund Goodenore. the other three wayes lying to the common

24.8/1643. It is agreed betwene Roger Marminster senior on the one part & Robert Beest on the other part that whereas the said Roger Marminster gave a parcell of meadow lying in the west meadow in Sudbury containing by estimation ten acres or thereabout to the same more or lesse, and the said Robert Beest gave a parcell of meadow lying by Crotons gades, joyning to a parcell of meadow of Edmund Goodenore, containing by estimation more or lesse about to the same more or lesse; they the said Roger Marminster & the said Robert Beest came with a joynt consent & arranged oarewyt, othe, that is to say, that the said Roger Marminster shall for ever enjoy the said parcell of meadow formerly by granted to the said Robert Beest. & the said Robert Beest shall enjoy the said parcell of meadow granted to the said Roger Marminster, witness given unto Roger Marminster Junior, John Croton, Hugh Briffen.

1645. Granted to Robert Beest he also does of upland lying on the west side of the river being part of a parcell of land called Wolantree gill.

Also five acres & a halfe of meadow lying in the third division of meadows lying in a parcell of meadows that goeth out of the gate towards Coundbourne lying betwene the meadows formerly granted to Andrew Belger now in the possession of John Goodenore & the meadow of Thomas May.

Also one acre of meadow for allowance w^{ch} is in the meadows next about the rart pety that goeth out the brook towards ridge meadows.

Also granted and layd out to the heirs of Robert Beest in the year 1643 one hundred and thirty acres to it more or lesse in the two miles last granted the town of Sudbury which sayd one hundred and thirty acres is the grove and thirtyish lot and lying in the north west square surving the lands of John Tridat on the north and the lands of the heirs of William Twy junior on the south and butty on the west upon the wilderness and butty on the east upon the middle of the way and second square
