

The lands of Thomas Noye

his house lot containing four acres having the house lot of Bryan
the end lot on the south side, and the house lot of George Munnings
on the north side.

Also seven acres of upland having a piece of land of Walter Hayme
on the south side and a piece of upland of William Mordaunt on the north side.

Also fourteen acres and a half of upland lying at the north west
corner on the west side of the River having a piece of upland of
Walter Hayme on the north side and the great meadow on the east side.

Also four acres and a half of meadow having Robert Duncull's meadow
on the south side and the meadow of John Maynard on the north side.

Also ten acres on the west side of the River having the meadow
of Walter Hayme on the south side and the meadow of John Stone
on the north side.

All the several parcels of upland and meadow were fully
granted to the said Thomas Noye by the same more or less
without contradiction.

1643. Granted to Thomas Noye ten acres of upland on the west side of the River by
the same more or less adjoining to the south side of the land formerly grant-
ed to the said Thomas Noye; with a zigzag way on the south side, with parts of the
said land from the land of Robert Boast.

1646. Granted to Thomas Noye 6 acres of upland lying north to his four between
the meadow of the said Thomas Noye and the High way. Also 7 acres and one quarter of
meadow lying in a piece of meadow yet gone out of the gift towards common bounds
between the meadow of Robert Boast and the meadow of the said Thomas Noye. Also 4 acres of meadow
allowance lying in the west end of a meadow in the north part of the same bounds. Of
6 acres of upland was given him by his father-in-law Walter Hayme.

Laid out to Thomas Noye eight acres of upland and six acres of meadow
joining together at the west end of the land of Thomas Noye formerly
granted and run from his former grant of land towards the common
part part that goes to pasture meadows. The eight acres of upland
was part of ten acres of upland that was formerly granted to
Solomon Johnson. Also the six acres of meadow was granted to
Solomon Johnson the 24th of August 1646. by the same parcels of
upland and meadow Solomon Johnson sold to Thomas Noye.

Also laid out to Thomas Noye two acres of meadow by the same
more or less lying in a piece of meadow called white meadow lying
between Duncull's meadow and pasture meadow with this two acres
joining west to the meadow of John Hayme and run East of the
a little stream. This two acres was granted to Thomas Noye in
satisfaction for the high way that goes through his first division
of meadow near the bridge and the said Thomas Noye sold this
two acres to Thomas Noye.

39. Laid out also to Thomas Noye one acre more of meadow by the
same more or less lying in the lower end of Duncull's joining to
the meadow granted to Mr. Peter Noye on the west and the east side
a white oak on each side the meadow marked to bound it. This acre of
meadow was granted to William Corley in satisfaction for the high
way going through his meadow at the bridge, and the said William Corley
sold this acre of meadow to Thomas Noye.
