

Also granted and layd out unto Thomas noyes in the years 1658
one hundred and thirty acres of land be it more or less in the two
miles of land left granted the town of Sudbury which sayd
one hundred and thirty acres of land lyeth in the first squadron
where Doofin hill having by land of John blanford on the
south and the lands of walter Gains on the north being
the second lot bounded at the east and by a highway going to the first
miles of land first granted the town of Sudbury
also being bounded at the west end by the middle eight way
going to the fourth squadron all which sayd one hundred
and thirty acres of land the sayd Thomas noyes resigned up
to the town of Sudbury for and in consideration of the like
quantity of land granted unto him the sayd Thomas noyes
by the town of Sudbury at and about his meadow at
Doughdall as in the other book appeareth
