Also fifteene acres of upland or there about her the same more or lesse lyinge on a north of land over against the house lott of the south street ~~runninge~~ lyinge betwene the lande of Anthony Whyte and John parmenter senior

Also seven acres of meadow lyinge in the great meadow be the same more or lesse lyinge betwene Anthony Whyte on the south side and John parmenter senior on the north side

Also septeene acres in the great meadow beinge the fourteenth lott be the same more or lesse. ioyninge to Mr William Holham on the west side and John Stone on the east side.

Also layd out to Thomas Browne his third division of meadow beinge eleven acres & a halfe lyinge in the inland meadow on the east side of the River one p^{ar}te containinge an acre lyinge alonge compassed in w^{ch} upland & lyeth in the east parte of the town bounde & lyeth towards the lyne that parts water towns of (Sudbury) another p^{ar}te containinge an acre & a halfe at the North corner of the upland at ~~the~~ ^{the} ~~the~~ ^{the} compassed w^{ch} upland the other myne acres lyeth in a p^{ar}te of meadow that is betwene the upland of huge Criffyn & the house lott of John Buddock & Henry Gurtiss, this myne acres lyeth betwene the meadow layd out to John Moore & the meadow of John Buddock & Henry Gurtiss & others that is at the North east end of th^{er} house lott.
