

Egen given & granted by ^{his} Town into m^r Jodges Noyes c. 1635 Edwrd
 assigns for best four Acres of meadow ground (be it more or less) ~
 actually lying & being laid out to begin on the N^W corner of the great Riv^r
 of Sudbury in Long meadow joining to the said four Acres of meadow good land
 laid before, to wit: as it is then a piece of meadow ground now lying all
 together in one whole parcel meadow & bounded by the Town square as
 follows: (viz) the line begins at the N^W corner at the old mark w^{ch} is a
 good stump of a tree, & from the said line runs due west first to a
 round mark, & from the said mark to a small oak tree mark, & from the said
 line runs cross to meadow northward to a small walnut tree mark, & from
 the said line runs westward to a small weal oak tree mark on the East
 side of a small spring or lip of meadow running up to a swamp, & from the said
 line runs southward to the old stump where it began.
