Sudbury Octob^r 15th 1754

Laid out to Mr John Brigham three Acres & Thirteen Rods
of Upland & Swamps Lying in Sudbury in the Easterly thirty
Rods wide Way, Lying near the House, wherein his father
Thomas Brigham now Dwells, Bounded as follows. - vizt.
Beginning at a heap of Stones in the Line of a Lott of Land
lately laid out to Mr Oliver Suffer, and Runs on T. Suffer's
Land Westerly one Rod & three Quarters to a small pine Mark
by the Side of a Way - Then Runs on T. Way Northwesterly
two Angles, first Nine Rods & half - then five Rods - Then Runs
North Easterly Seventeen Rods on a Slip of Land; left for a
two Rod Way - Then Runs North 43 Degrees, East twenty one
Rods, on land formerly laid out to the Brigbams for an Allowance
Lott - Then Running Easterly on common Land, as the Fence now
stands two Angles; first Eight Rods, then Eight Rods & half to the
old Town Line - Then runs South Seventeen Degrees, West
twelve Rods on T. Old Town Line, to an Old Stake & Stones about
it - then Runs West Seventeen Degrees North twelve Rods on Land
formerly laid out to Joseph Maynard - for an Allowance Lott
to a Stake & heap of Stones then on T. Allowance Lott forty one
Rods to the heap of Stones first mentioned
