Laid out to S^r Ezekiel How of S^d Sudbury & to his Heirs & Assigns
for ever Twenty Acres and one Quarter of an Acre of Land at
and in the Southerly End of the Second & Westerly Thirty Rod wide
Highway (so called) lying & being in the Lands Commonly called
and known by the Name of the New Grants in S^d Sudbury
and is Bounded Southerly on Framingham Line Eastwardly on Isaac
Read in part & Partly on Nathan Moores Lands - Northwesterly
and Westerly on the Lands of the S^d Ezekiel How and is further
Bounded as may Appear by the plans as above Set forth and
Described - Surveyed by John Haynes

Here is a Plan of Six Acres and 25 Rods of Land and Meadow
which I have laid out unto En^r Abijah Haynes of Said Sudbury
(at his desire) Situate lying and being in Sudbury above sd
and is in and Joyning to the most Southwesterly Branch of a
Meadow called and known by the Name of Long Meadow and is
in the Easterly Thirty Rods Highway so called in the Lands called
the New Grants and is Bounded as Set forth by this Plan.
