

his house lott lymge in the southe street containinge fivē acres or there  
about w<sup>th</sup> a little peece of meadow at the end of it containinge by  
estimation halfe an acre of there about the end of w<sup>ch</sup> house lott and  
meadow butt upon the mill brooke. and lyeth over against a necke of land  
on the other side of mill brooke the other end lyeth against the hight way  
goinge into the east end of the great river meadow and lyeth betweene  
Andrew Belcher and Peter Maye.

Also another peece of land lymge upon a necke of land over against  
the lott of the southe street containinge by estimation fivē acres the one  
end butt upon the mill brooke and the other end butt upon the mill brooke  
and lyeth between Andrew Belcher and the hight way that goeth to  
Guthrieuatt.

Also a peece of meadow lymge in the great river meadow containinge  
by estimation two acres it lyeth neere the east end of the meadow. and  
lyeth between Peter Maye and Andrew Belcher. the one end upon the  
hight way that lyeth upon the north side of the great meadow. and  
the other end butt upon m<sup>r</sup> Thronnd the pastore meadow that was  
given him called his gratulation.

Also another peece of meadow lymge in the great river meadow  
containinge four acres or there about lymge towarde the north end  
of the great meadow towarde Comord lymge between that w<sup>ch</sup> was  
granted to Richard White and Andrew Belcher and butt upon the  
hight way that lyeth against the east side of that meadow and the  
other end butt upon the upland on the west side of that meadow.

1642. Granted to Thomas Goodnow ten acres of upland be it more or lesse  
lying upon the ~~upland~~ outfirts of the town: southward joyning  
to a meadow, the north end butt upon a gill: joyning to the  
land of Robert Darrell on the west side.

23(12) 1643. It is agreede betweene Thomas Goodnow of William Ward, that w<sup>ch</sup> was the  
said Thomas gatt, a partall of meadow containinge four acres or there a-  
bout lying in the great river meadow, betweene the meadow of An-  
drew Belcher & the said William Ward. And the said William Ward gatt,  
a partall of meadow containinge by estimation fivē acres or there about  
lying in the great river meadow, betweene the meadow formerly granted  
to Wickershill of John Knight. And the said Thomas & William by a joint  
consent gave & conveyed the w<sup>ch</sup> they, that is to say, that the said Thomas &  
for ever enjoy the said fivē acres formerly belonging to the said William  
Ward, & the said William Ward shall for ever enjoy the said four acres  
formerly granted belonging to the said Thomas Goodnow.

1644. Peter Maye in exp<sup>re</sup> granted to Thomas Goodnow fivē acres of upland  
lying upon a neck of land betweene Mill brook & mill brooke w<sup>ch</sup> lyeth at  
the end next to Mill brooke joyning to the land of Robert Darrell. so much  
at large in the land of Peter Maye. fol. 10.

Granted to Thomas Goodnow 3 acres of Meadow lying in the lower end of the  
Gulfe next unto the great river meadow & joyns upward into the Gulfe to the  
meadow of Henry Rice. Also one acre of meadow be the same meadow & the  
51 lying in the lower end of the said lower meadow on the north side of mill brooke  
lying between the meadow of Thomas Bishop & the division of upland of  
Thomas Browne. +
