

2nd house lott lyinge on the Northwest corner containyng foure arres more or less lyinge on the North east side of the highway that goeth into the meadowe haingge five arres and a halfe of upland for his second addition lyinge at the northwest end of Solomon Johnsons house lott and buttynge upon the meadowe.

Also foure arres of meadowe. beinge beinge the first dividend lyinge on both sides the river the south east end. buttynge upon the second division of upland of Bryen Bondleton & lyinge between the meadowe of Thomas Burmaster & good man wilford.

Also his second dividend of meadowe containyng eight arres. lyinge at the lower end of the meadow between Peter Wright and the river w^{ch} parteth the bounde between fudbury & Concord.

Also fourtteen arres of upland. lyinge on the north east side of the river and on the north west side runninge to the land of William ward and Solomon Johnson a little brooke runninge throughe the middle of it and goe into the meadowe the west end of it buttynge upon the great meadowe.

Granted unto John ffroome a parcell of upland containyng by estimatione seven arres or there about betwixt some more or less; lyinge on the north side of the highway that leadeth into the great River meadow; w^{ch} way parteth the land of Walter Chaine of John ffroome, adjoyning to the lower end of John ffroomes house lott, w^{ch} said land was formerly granted to Thomas Hoyt.

1646

Mr. Hoyt gave unto John ffroome sixtyn arres of meadow per the same more or less lyinge in the great river meadow, beinge a pt of ye 2nd division of meadow of ye said Mr. Hoyt & his w^{ch} ye meadow of John ffroome we goyng to Concord Line. And ye said Mr. Hoyt gave unto ye said John ffroome all right in Commonage belonging to ye said sixtyn arres of meadow.

Also granted to John ffroome six arres of meadow per the same more or less lyinge in a piece of Island meadow next to Concord Line lyinge between the meadow of Mr. William Pelham & ye meadow of John Pimms Junior beinge John ffroomes 3rd division of meadow.

Also layd out to John ffroome three arres & a halfe of meadow lyinge in the meadowe one the west side of the river between the meadowe of Edmund Goodenows & the meadowe of the river fent that three arres & a halfe of meadowe was the third division of meadowe due to Thomas Burmaster w^{ch} was the best way sold to John ffroome. Also an arres & a halfe of meadowe for allowance to the third division of meadowe, & lyeth in the meadowe between the meadowe granted to William Peley & the meadowe granted to Henry Puntel.

Also granted and layd to Joseph ffroome in the year 1648 one good and adjoynt arres of land betwixt more or less lyinge and beinge in the two miles last granted the town of Sudbury beinge the fifty lot and lyeth in the first square containing the lands of Mr. Basson on the south and the land of John my Curtis on the north buttynge on the east on the highway goinge rods wide and the first miller first granted to some of Sudbury and buttynge on the west on the middle highway and the second and the first west square.
