

Agreeable to a Petition from Mr. Asa Smith, to us directed, praying for a road, to be layd out, from the county road, (near stone line) to said Smiths mills;

We the Subscribers, Selectmen of Sudbury, have attended and viewed the premises and do report as follows, viz — that we do lay out said road upon these conditions, — that the said Smith, is to give the land, where said road is to go and make the fence, and make and keep the said road in good repair, for the term of ten years, by the Towns expensing, Messrs. Benjamin Asa, & Harman Smiths highway taxes, for that term of time — the bounds of said road are, as follows — Beginning at a stake & stone, at the foot of the Hill, on the County road, thence running a Northwesterly ~~xxxx~~ direction (through the land of Messrs. Benjamin & Harman Smiths) to a black Oak tree marked, thence running the same course, to a large chestnut tree marked, thence running a circuitous direction, ^{till it comes} to the Northeastly corner of said Asa Smiths saw mill, said road is layd out two rods wide, and on the Easterly side of said bounds, and we further report, that the Town is to give, the said Asa Smith the sum of twelve dollars, in consideration of his making a fence upon one side of said road, and for a bridge already built across the river to said mills, we
