oak tree marked also two white pine trees marked, thence to a
stake and stones on the bank of the old field thence to a stone near
the fence thence as the same now stands to a stake and stone thence
to two oak trees marked to land of the said Levi Smith all the
bounds to be on the westerly side of said way said way to be no wider
with leave to pass and repass as occasion may require without damage
to the said William and William Jr the said William is to take off the
standing wood on said way on or before the fifteenth day of October
next we also Assess damage to the said William & William Jr the sum of
Twenty Dollars the said Levi is to give bonds to the Town for all damage
of said way
