Also five acres and a halfe of meadow buttynge upon part of the
aforesaid four acres of upland. lyinge on the south west side of Thomas
Goodnow.

Also two acres more of meadow together with three acres w^{ch} he
bought of Solomon Johnson. buttynge against the second division of
upland of Bryan J. Andleton.

Also six acres of meadow that he bought beinge part of the second
division of meadow of Edmond first lyinge on both sides the River.
beinge the four and thirtieth lott of the second division of meadow.

Also eleven acres of upland w^{ch} ~~twenty~~ acres that the towne gave
him lyinge on the north east side of the River towards Concord lynd
the south west end buttynge on the meadow the north east end buttynge
forwards Concord lynd. a little brooke runninge through the middell
of it & forminge to the land of Solomon Johnson & John Freeman.

acres formerlye belonginge to the said William Ward, and the said
William Ward shall for ever enjoy the said four acres formerlye
belonging to the said Thomas Goodnow.

William Ward of Sudbury bought of Mr William Pelham a pecke of
meadow containing by estimation ^{three} three or thereabouts
or less with all right in commonage thereto belonging lyinge towards
Lynd in the way yt leads for Sudbury to Concord joyninge to the
said William Ward w^{ch} pecke of meadow yt of the 3^d division of meadow of Mr
William Pelham. Witness Augst Griffin.

Granted to William Ward 7 acres three quarters of meadow lyinge in the gulch
betwene the meadow of ~~John Wood~~ John Parminter Senior.

Also sixteene acres of meadow lyinge in the meadow on the south west side
of the meadow of Walter Haynes w^{ch} said meadow 6 acres of it was granted
to John Rediat & by him sold to the said William Ward with the commonage thereto
belonging.

Also two acres of meadow yt lyinge towards Concord lynd or betwene the meadow
of the said William Ward & a pecke of meadow yt the said William Ward bought
of Mr William Pelham: w^{ch} two acres was then sold to the 3^d division of
meadow: & by him given to the said John Rediat & sold to William Ward
with the commonage thereto belonging.
