Also granted and layd out unto William Ward in the year 1658
one hundred and thirty acres of land be it more or less in the two
mills of land last granted the town of Sudbury the sayd one
hundred and thirty acres of land being the thirtieth lot and
lyeth in the second squadron having the lands of Gosfield gains
on the north and the Country road to Lancaster on the south
being bounded at the east end by the zig way and the first miles
of land first granted the town of Sudbury also bounded at the
west end by the middle zig way and third squadron, only let
it be remembered that the sayd Lancaster had doke cutt from
upon the sayd land and doke sett some of the sayd land on
the south side of the sayd way by sale and reason of
some hollow dokes of land which he sett the sayd way upon
the sayd land, and also the sayd Lancaster way being incommen-
as being stated formerly by the town of Sudbury and Lancaster
