

his house lott containing foure acres lying between the house lott of Edmond Vire on the south side and the house lott of Hugh Griffen on the north side of it

Also one acre of upland. parted from his house lott by the higg way and lying between the lande of Edmond Vire on the south side and Hugh Griffen on the north side

Also three acres of upland. in the north of land lying between timber meade and on the south side of it and the lande of Edmond Vire lying on the south side of it and the lande of Robert Darrell on the north side

Also eight acres of upland on the west side of the Vire lying by Goodman's wigwam lying on the north side to the lande of Edmond Vire and on the south side to the lande of Hugh Griffen

Also two acres of meadow lying in the great meadow butting on the south side to the meadow of Edmond Vire and on the north side to the meadow of Hugh Griffen

Also four acres of meadow being the first lott in the second division of meadow lying in the great river meadow between the meadow of Bryan Wendleton on the north side and on the south side to a great meadow reserved to the town of Sudbury

13 (2) 1644. John How doth possess & enjoy by way of exchange five acres of land of Edmond Vire near to the house of his ward, & two acres of John Moor's upon pine plains next to the land of Edmond Goodnow. at forty shillings and pence. 130. in John Moor's land. Granted to John How four acres of upland lying upon pine plains on the north side of the way that leads from Sudbury to Water town, & joining westerly to the land of an^{ed} Hunt other way of or ways lying to the eight ways of Common.

Also granted and laid out to John How in the year 1648 one garden and thirty acres of land and meadow be it more or less lying and being in the two miles of land last granted the town of Sudbury being by six thirty lot and lying in the second square town having the lands of Henry Loker on the south and the lands formerly granted to Edmond Vire on the north being bounded at the east end by a higg way lying westerly westerly lying higg way higg way to the lands first granted by Town of Sudbury and also being bounded on the west end by a middle higg way and by higg square town

July the 14 1694. Granted by the town of Sudbury and laid out by Deacon John Hamond, Mr Joseph Noyes, & John Goodnow: who were appointed by the town to state and settle & settle as followeth. a piece of land joining all along to his field and orchard from the brown north corner to the main road, orchard being fifty rods in length and at the north end is twelve rods in breadth butting upon the higg way that leads along by west meadow bounded at the north east corner with a substantial stake made of a horred piece of timber and is a straight line to a black oak standing by the by the way side next the main road orchard. the end line is four rods in breadth this said land as it is now butted and bounded by it
