

Granted and layd out To Josiah T Hays in the year 1668 one hundred and thirty acres of land in the two last miles of land granted the Town of Sudbury being the fourpoint lot and lying in the second square having the lands of William Ward on the south and the lands of Henry Lister on the north being bounded at the east end by a right way forty rods wide and the first mile of land first granted the Town of Sudbury at the west end being bounded by the middle right way great pond and third square
