S. 43° E. over Sarah Haynes' land four rods over old road
two rods to a stake and stones on the easterly side
of ^{the} old road: S. 21° 30' E. over old road and land of William
Hunt 3rd twenty five rods to a stake and stones. Thence
S. 33° 45' E. over old road and land of William Hunt 3rd
fifteen rods: over land of Josiah Hildbrand five rods
and twelve links to a stake and stones: S. 57° 45' E.
over said Adams' land fifty three rods to a stake
and stones and S. 63° 30' E. over William Hunt 3rd land
and old road thirteen rods to a stake and stones on
the northerly side of Stone burying ground road wes-
-tely of the dwelling house of said William Hunt 3rd in
Sudbury. Said road to be three rods wide on the southerly
side of said lines and boundaries. William Parker Esq.
shall have the privilege of a share way under said
road by making and keeping the same in repair.
And it is ordered by said county commissioners that
the towns of Stow and Sudbury shall on or before the
tenth day of May A. D. 1832 complete and finish the parts
of said new highway within their respective jurisdictions
at least twenty four feet wide to be crowned eighteen
inches, reduce all hills to an angle of four and the banks
on the outside of the ditch to an angle of fifty five
degrees with the horizon and in all places where the land
is loamy or sandy they shall deposit and spread at
least six inches of gravel on the average after having
raised the low ground two feet above the natural surface
and shall make good and sufficient stone chimneys
where necessary and shall finish said road in the
most faithful and workmanlike manner according
to the reasonable requirements and to the satisfaction
of the
