

Granted to John Goodenow five acres three quarters of
meadow being his third division of meadow lying next to the
upper end of the gulfe betwene the meadow of John Parmenter
son of the meadow of John Coll.

Also layd out to John Goodenow twenty acres of upland being
parts of the land he bought of Andrew Belger & layd next to
the outside of the town bounde furthest on the south side of the brook
that goes down to the west meadow & bridge point.

Also five acres & a quarter of meadow lying in a parcell of
meadow that goes out of the gulfe toward the town bounde lying
betwene the meadow of Mr Mayb & the meadow of Robert Best
viz the third division of meadow due to Andrew Belger. Also
five acres of meadow for allowance lying upon the west meadow
brook at the lower end of the meadow & lying betwene the
meadow of Mr William Melham & the meadow of Mr Mayb.

Also granted and layd out to Jane Goodenow widow in the year 1658
one hundred and thirty acres of land be it more or less lying
and being in the two miles last granted the Town of Colbury
the layd on hundred and thirty acres being the thirty mints
lot and lying in the third squadron having the land of
John Coll on the north and the gage way which leads to
lane after on the south being bounded on the west with
widownes and bounded on the east with the middle gage way
and second squadron.

And also whereas Lifford Goodenow forgent Grant and Thomas Moyes
were appointed arbiters with the 5 of January 1662 to measure the meadow
of the widow Goodenow in the west meadow and to allow for satisfaction
according to their indgement and consideration they the said Lifford
Goodenow forgent Grant and Thomas had in the year 1664 granted
by and with the Towns consent that the said widow Goodenow shall
have and hold the two landing places for hay which were formerly
the meadows of the said John Goodenow the one said landing place
is at about of land called the yellowes marsh. And the other of
John Goodenow the other said landing place is over next to the
point, also granted liberty to the widow Goodenow to set her four
at the meadow at bridge point on the east side of the river
upon the upland a little about the water marsh as it was
marked and stated by Lifford Goodenow forgent Grant and
Thomas Moyes the 2 of April 1664 also stated the line
of the said widow Goodenows meadow in the west meadow
and at the north end of the said meadow the stated stand
and remain as they did the said meadow being near two
miles divide by the brook. This done by us Edmund Gardiner
John Cowart and Thomas Moyes according to the town
the 5 of January 1662.
