Agreeable to a petition of David Howe and others - We the Subscribers
Selectmen of the town of Sudbury have laid out a Town road from the
gate road leading from Worcester to Boston through land of Mr
Joel Jones beginning at a Stake and Stones at brimstone dam so
called, thence running twenty rods South easterly to a Stake
and Stones thence thirty four rods to a Stake and Stones thence
thence running twelve rods to a Stake and Stones thence
running twenty seven rods to land Adam Howes to a
Stake and Stones thence running seven rods through
said Howes land to an oak tree marked in William
Hayden land thence as the fence now stands through
said Hayden land thence through David Howes land
and thence through Levi Smiths land to David Howes
Farm the said road to be one and a half rods wide the
bounds all on the westerly side the said petitioners agree
to pay said Jones damages for his land.
