The Commissioners of Highways for this county make to
this court here the following return: "Commonwealth
of Massachusetts Middlesex Co. at a meeting of the
Commissioners of Highways for said County on the second
day of Oct. A.D. 1827. Present Caleb Butler Esq. Chairman
Augustus Tawer Esq. David Townsend Esq. & Benj. T. Varnum
Esq. Commissioners — On the petitions of Joseph Davis Jr.
and others first presented to the Hon. Court of Sessions for
said county at Cambridge on the first Tuesday of
January A.D. 1825 & in due course of law transferred to
said Commissioners praying for a new highway from
the line of Northborough in the county of Worcester through
the towns of Marlborough Sudbury East Sudbury Weston
Walham Watertown to the place where the Watertown
turnpike commences" the inhabitants of said Sudbury and
East Sudbury and all persons interested having had due
notice of the time place and purposes of said meeting
as will appear by the returns annexed said Commissioners
proceeded to view and consider the common convenience
and necessity of laying out one piece of such new
highway prayed for partly in said Sudbury and
partly in said East Sudbury and one piece thereof wholly
in said Sudbury and having viewed the proposed route
for such new highways and heard the parties for and
against the same and fully understood the same
it is considered and adjudged by said Commissioners
that said two pieces of new highway as herein after
laid out
