 west on the old road two rods on land of William Heard
 4 rods crossing a small corner of Samuel Russell's land
 and on land set off as dower to Melisent Reeves the
 wife of Silvester Reeves the reversion thereof being in the
 heirs of Nathaniel Reeves Jr. deceased 17 Rods on an old
 road 6 rods on land of Converse Francis 92 Rods on
 land of Richard Heard 24½ rods on land of Ebenezer
 Barnes 29 Rods on land of Charles Grant 11 rods and
 again on land of said Barnes 38 rods being in the whole
 223½ rods to a stake and stones at a place called bridge
 thence S. 86° West on land of William M. Kuster Ephraim Moore
 Benjamin Rice Thaddeus Cowen and Caleb Moore 104 rods to
 the western side of the meadow thence the same course on
 land of Simeon Moor 41 rods to Sudbury line on Gotham
 Goodmans land 10 rods to a stake & stones thence S. 80° W.
 on said Goodmans land to East Sudbury line 58 rods
 and on the same in East Sudbury 28½ rods on Cyrus Taylors
 land 26½ rods to Sudbury line again and on the same in
 Sudbury 2½ rods on Caleb Moores land 12½ rods and on
 Herman Smiths land 54 rods to a stake & stones at the end
 of his shed and thence to the northeast corner of his barn
 at the old road said new highway to be on the northern
 side of said lines and boundaries and to be three rods
 wide from the beginning thereof the distance of one hundred
 and ninety nine rods thence six rods wide 24½ rods to the
 stake and stones at bridge point thence four rods wide
 104 rods across the meadow thence six rods wide 20 rods
 and the remainder three rods wide.
