England 1658 one hundred and thirty acres of upland and meadow
be it more or less lying and being in the two last miles of land
granted the town of Sudbury by said one hundred and thirty
acres of upland and meadow is the fourth part of the lot and is and lies
in the fourth squadron of lots being bounded on the south by the
lands of John How also bounded on the north by the lands of
Philimon Robalt also being bounded at the east end by a six way
thirty rods wide and the five miles of land first granted the
town of Sudbury and bounded at the west end by the sixth
six way and third squadron of lots, the said one hundred
and thirty acres of upland and meadow by said Edmund Rice
for alienated delivered unto the said Mayor of Sudbury in
the year 1660 with all the appurtenances and benefits whatsoever

We the Subscribers Selectmen of the Towns of
Concord and Sudbury met by appointment and
perambulated the lines and renewed the bounds
between said towns to the mutual satisfaction of both
Parties according to Law.
