of Sudbury & Marlborough to preambulate the  
lines between said Sudbury & Marlborough and  
to renew the bounds have this day attended that  
service and have renewed the following Bounds  
beginning at a large fresh pine tree about 50 rods  
southward of Concord road it being a corner bound  
between Marlborough & Town 2<sup>d</sup> a small white oak  
tree 40 or 50 rods from the first mentioned bound  
3<sup>d</sup> a stake & stones in a field belonging to the  
heirs of Abner Walker 4<sup>th</sup> a fresh pine tree  
in the fence between the heirs of Abner  
Walker & Israel Parmenter 5<sup>th</sup> a red oak tree  
near a Brook 6<sup>th</sup> a stake & stones on a small  
hill about 40 rods from said red oak tree  
7<sup>th</sup> a stake & stones about 28 rods from the 6<sup>th</sup> bound  
on a small hill 8<sup>th</sup> a stake & stones about ten rods north  
of the Widow Patience Burfells House 9<sup>th</sup> a large stone  
marked being a corner bound between Framingham and  
Sudbury &c

bound are all marked S. M.
