and from Edward's line runs to a creek in Blackoak field
two marked standing on the south side of Toronto road
on the east side of a gravelly hill containing sixty rods:
from Edward's line runs southerly to the next east corner
of E's lands formerly lying to the east of from Edward's line
runs still along by E's so former lands to the south east
corner where we had E's measuring began: E's is
granted him by an exchange for a like quantity of E's
land on the plain where E's gate was situated surrounded
to the south in line of the south west of the old at the
corner disposed for ever:

Also laid out to Joseph Curtis nine acres of upland by Deon John
Haines Capt Thomas Brown Joseph Noyes by virtue of Town act
for the 1st 1691 with nine acres of land the sd Joseph Curtis
bought of Sir Joseph Freeman and do lie near common Swamp
and now is reserved up for the Town use in law of which fore said
land for the 15th the sd Committee according to Town act laid
out nine acres of land at the end of his own land joining to
a piece of Capt Brown's meadow in two parts the first part of three
and a half acres and bounded beginning at a pine tree by the side of
his own land and so running a northward line over the Brocks
to a white oak southward of Concord road and so a bowing
line by the path to a small white oak. The other part being
five acres and the quarters joining to the fore said land
at the east end beginning at a red oak and so runs south
east over the Brocks to a little scrubbed white oak and from
thence westward to the corner of Capt Brown's meadow an
aspe being there marked and so joins to his own land
