by estimation halfe an acre or there about lying in the south
street betwene Richard Norton and Henry Pernties

Also a parcell of upland ronteymng by estimation six acres or
there about be the land more or less lying on a neck of land
on the southside of mill brooke betwene the Lande of Richard Norton
and Henry Pernties

Also a parcell of upland ronteymng by estimation vnder acres
or there about be the land more or less lying on the westside of
the River betwene the Lande of Robert Daruill and William
Gronnd the south end butting to the west meadowe.

Also a parcell of meadow ronteymng by estimation two acres or
there about be the land more or less lying at Bridgepoint betwene
the meadow of Richard Norton and Henry Pernties

Also a parcell of meadowe ronteymng by estimation four acres
and a halfe or there about be the land more or less lying in the
great River meadow betwene the meadow of Henry Pernties
and William Barker.

1642. In the year 1642 John Parmenter Junior bought of Henry Pernties
the house lott of the said Henry Pernties containing by estimation foure
acres or there about with a parcell of meadow adjoining to the south end of
the said house lott of the said Henry Pernties and of it runneth to mill brooke with
lyeth betwene the Lande of the said Richard Norton of the house lott of the
said John Parmenter.

John Parmenter this division of meadowe granted & layd out in a pte
of meadowe that goeth out of the lower end of the Gulf of Toward Comond bounde
containing three acres three quarters be it more or less lyeth betwene the
meadowe of John Fudman & the third division of meadowe of George Mun
might layd out to Mr Peter Mayo.

Also granted and layd out unto John Parmenter Junior in the year
1643 one hundred and thirty acres of Land be it more or less in
the two miles of land last granted the town of Andbury being
the nine and fortieth lot and lyeth in the south west and fourth
squadron having the Lande of Mr William Palmer on the north and
the Lande of Thomas Kings on the south being bounded at the west end
by the willowes and also being bounded at the east end by the mill
dyke way adjoining to the first Squadron of lots.
