

his house lott containing by estimation eight acres of or there about to the
said more or less lying between the house lott of Edmond Goodenow
and the widdow Wright four acres whereof was William Brownes house lott
which John Coll bought of William Brownes

Also a parcell of meadowes containing by estimation five acres or there
about to the said more or less lying in the great river meadowes
between the meadow of the widdow Hunt and Richard Newton

Laid out to John Coll four acres of a parte of upland parted from
his house lott by the highway of wether to wether granted him one
acre and a halfe two acres more he bought of William Brownes and
an acre and a halfe he bought of William Gore

Also granted to John Coll four acres of meadowes to the
said more or less lying in the lower parte of the said meadowes
between the meadowes of John Loker and the meadowes of
John Goodenow.

Also granted to John Coll twelve acres of upland lying on
the west side of the River near Strawberry Hill westerly joyning
to the Lande of John Blandford Easterly to a marked tree upon
a little rocke ^{the highway} lying to the Common westerly
is all his house lott and third division of upland beside an acre and a halfe
that he had at his house.

1658 Also granted and laid out unto John Coll in the years 1658 one hundred and
thirty acres of land be it more or less in the two miles of land last granted
the town of Sudbury the said one hundred and thirty acres of land being
the thirty eighth lot and lye in the fourth square at the westermost
end of the great open heay bounded on the north side by the lands of
Solomon Goufon Junior and also bounded on the south side by the lands
of Jane Goodenow widow also bounded at the west end by the widdowes
and bounded at the east end by the middle highway running at the
westermost end of the same.
