

We the subscribers Selectmen of the town of Sudbury have laid out for the use of said town a Town Way as follows

Beginning at a Black Oak tree on the south side of the Berlin road at land of Oladiah Perry then running Southwesterly over the traveled way leading to Ephraim Moore's 4 rods to a Stake & Stones then South 40 rods over said traveled way to a white oak stump with stones upon it then Southwest 39 rods partly over said traveled way & partly over land of said Perry to a Stake & Stones on the Southeasterly side of said traveled way continues Southwesterly 19 rods over said traveled way to a White Pine tree marked on the west side of said traveled way continues Southwesterly 27 rods through land of Daniel M. Moore and land of said Perry to a Stake & Stones on the ~~east~~^{east} side of said traveled way continues Southwesterly 15 rods over said traveled way to a Stake & Stones at land of Ephraim Moore, to be two rods wide and to lie on the westerly side of said course; and the said Perry & Moore released all damages for laying said road through their land — Which said road is hereby reported to the town for their acceptance & when accepted & recorded is forever after to be known as a public town way.
