Granted to Robert Davies myne sonne a palle of vpland be the same
more or less, lying vppon the outfeinte of the town: southward butting vppon
a meadow, the north end butting vppon a gill called Popps gill, ioyning
to the land of Thomas Goodnow on the east side.

1643

Robt Davies bought of Antony Wighte fiftene acres of vpland be the same more
or less lying in a north of land behosene millbrooke & pyndbrooke & lyed be-
howsne the land of Peter noyes & the land granted to Thomas Browne, six
acres whereof the said Antony bought of William Warter.

Also ten acres of meadow be the same more or less lying in the great river
meadows in two parcells, ten acres lying behosene the meadows formerly
granted to Thomas Browne on the one side & William Warter on the other
side, the other seven acres lying behosene the meadow of Peter noyes on the
one side & the meadow granted to Henry Warter on the other side,
with all right & priviledges belonging to the said Antony Wighte in Sudbury.

Also granted and layd out unto Robert Davies his heirs in the yere 1658
one hundred and forty arrow of land and meadow be it more or less
lying and being in the two last miles granted the town of Sudbury being the
two last lot and lying in the first squadron at a place called the Gole and
loyneth to the land of biflowe and thodenow on the south and the six
way waying headeth to Lancaster on the north and butty on the east
upon the six way and the five miles first granted the town of Sudbury
and butty upon the west upon the middle six way and fourth squadron
