

His householde containing by estimation fourt acres or there about
to the same more or less, lying between the householde of John
Goodnow and John Hammon senior

Also a parcell of upland containing by estimation one acre or
there about to the same more or less lying between the Land
of John Goodnow & the high way the leade to mill brook

Also one acre of meadowe to the same more or less lying in
the great river meadowe between the meadow of John Hammon
senior and John Goodnow

Also three acres and a halfe of meadowe to the same more or less
lying in the great river meadowe, lying between the meadow of
John Stone & John Knight formerly granted to good man Nisbark.

1643.

Granted to Henry Lokar two acres of upland to the same more or less lying
between the Land formerly granted to Joseph Tainter & now in the possession of
William Herley senior on the north side of it, & a spring running from the house of
Josephon weale to the River on the South side of it.
Also eight acres of upland to the same more or less lying in the south side of the
towne bounde the north end of it, lying to the high way leading from Waterhouse
to the Quarters of the west side of it joining to the Land of John Bont
easterly joining to the Land of John Lokar.

Granted to Henry Lokar 2 acres & a Line of meadow lying in the parished meadow
between the meadow of Robt Darin & the meadow of Walter Hamer.

Also granted to John Lokar two acres of meadow lying in the
low end of the parished meadowe to the same the meadow of
John Coll & John Herley senior.

Also granted and layd out unto Henry Lokar in the year 1658 one hundred and
thirty acres of Land to the same more or less in the two miles of Land last
granted the town of Sudbury being the first hints lot and by the
second squadron of lots having the Land on the south and the Land
of John How on the north being bounded at the east end by the high
way joining to the five miles first granted the town of Sudbury
and bounded at the west end by the middle high way joining to the
third squadron of lots.

Also layd out unto Henry Lokar one hundred and thirty acres of Land in the year
1658 the said Land being first granted to John Ward and purchased by Henry Lokar
of the said Ward the said Land lying in the two miles last granted the
town of Sudbury and is the twenty fourth lot being in the third
squadron of lots and lying at the compass of the south and the
east part of the great lot of John Ward on the north and the
Land of John King on the south being bounded at the west end by the
wildernes and at the east end by our middle high way joining to
our second squadron of lots

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
