October 11th 1816 We the subscribers being a Committee appointed by
the Town of Sudbury and Frammingham to preambulate the line and renew the
Bounds between said Towns we have this day attended that service and have
renewed the following Bound's (viz) Beginning at the River below the new bridge
so called at a stake and stones near a small Maple Tree marked 2nd westwardly to a
stake and stones 3rd to a stake and stones at the road 4th to a stake and stones by a stump
5th to a stake and stones near Aaron Hills 6th to a stake and stones 7th to a white oak tree
8th to a large Maple stump 9th to a stake and stones in a stump on the top of the hill
west of John Eatons 10th to a White oak tree 11th to a small maple 12th to a stake
and stones on the top of Nobscot Hill 13th to a Chestnut tree 14th to a Chestnut tree
15th to an Ash stump 16th to an oak tree 17th to a stake and stones near a small
pond 18th to a black birch tree 19th to a grass oak tree 20th to a high stone being
the Southwesterly corner of Sudbury

Acton October 12th 1816

When we the subscribers being legally appointed to preambulate the boundary
line between the Town of Sudbury and Acton did attend that service on the
12th Day of October A^d 1816, and perambulated said line and renewed the bounds
to the satisfaction of both parties which bounds are as follows beginning at a
stake and stones which is the Corner bounds between the Town of Concord
Sudbury and Acton, and thence westerly to a poplar tree marked thence
to a stake and stones on the ~~west~~ side of the hill thence the same course
to a white oak tree marked thence to a heap of stones by the river
