Granted by the town of Sudbury unto Mr James Shorman our minister six
acres of meadow or low land: Situated and being at the lower end of Long
meadow: and laid out & stated: by marked trees on all sides to the said
Deacon John Hamer and Sargent John Rutter to the full satisfaction and profit
of Mr Shorman: which six acres of meadow or low land bet the same meadow
or low: is to bet and remain the said Mr James Shorman his heirs and
assigns forever for ever his living and dying our minister in Sudbury

We the Subscribers Selectmen of the town of Sudbury and
Mortton have agreeable to a Law of the Commonwealth Preambled
and Premised the bounds between said towns as follows (viz)

- 1 Beginning at a pine tree being a corner bound between Mortton &
Stow about 50 Rods South of Concord road
- 2^d a white oak tree marked.
- 3^d a heap of stones in Walker field.
- 4th a pitch pine tree marked.
- 5th a red oak tree marked.
- 6th a stake and stones marked.
- 7th a stake and stones.
- 8th a stake and stones about 10 rods north of Mrs Russells house
- 9th a stake and stones about 60 rods South of said Russells house
- 10th a large stone lettered it being the corner bounds between
Sudbury and Wrentham
