

Be it remembered that on the twentieth day of May in the year of our Lord 1826.

- With the Subscribers preambulated the lines between the Town of Sudbury and Frammingham and renewed the following bounds (viz) 1st Beginning at the river below the new bridge (so called) at a stake and stones maple tree marked.
- 2^d thence westerly to a stake and stones on land of Jonⁿ. Ybill
- 3^d thence westerly at a stake and stones at the road.
- 4th to a stake at a large stump on land of Hopstall Brown
- 5th to a stake and stones near the road west of said Browns house
- 6th to a stake and stones on the top of a small hill
- 7th to a white oak tree on John Eaton land
- 8th to a stake and stones in a maple stump on land of said John Eaton.
- 9th to a stake and stones in a stump on the top of the hill west of William Eaton house.
- 10th to a white oak tree on land of John Brown
- 11th to a small maple tree on land of said John Brown.
- 12th to a stake and stones near the top of nobscat hill.
- 13th to a chusnut tree on land of Adam How.
- 14th to a chusnut tree on land of David How.
- 15th to a stake and stones in an ash stump on land of said David How.
- 16th to an oak tree on land of Adam How.
- 17th to a stake and stones near a small Pond.
- 18th to black birch tree on land formerly owned by Joshua Pomeroy
- 19th to a gray oak tree on land of Buckley How.
- 20th to a high stone it being at the south west corner of Sudbury
