Beginning at a Stake & Stones at the River 2^d a Stake & Stones 3^d a Stake & Stones by the Road Leading from Landham to Stones Mill 4th a Dry Oak tree 5th a Stake & Stones 6th a Stake & Stones 7th a Large White Oak tree Marked 8th a Large Maple tree Marked 9th a Stake & Stones in a Stump 10th a White oak tree Marked 11th a Small Maple by an old Maple Stump 12th a Stake & Stones on Nobscott - 13th a Chestnut tree 14th a Large Chestnut tree Marked 15th an ash tree Marked, 16th an Oak tree Marked 17th a Stake & Stones 18th a black birch tree Marked 19th a Dry red Oak tree Marked 20th a Red oak tree Marked 21st a Stone at Marlborough line all the foregoing Bound Marked, L. J.
