- 1st Bound Book, a heap of Stones upon it. —
- 2^d An old Pine Stump. —
- 3^d A large Pine Tree. —
- 4th An old Pine Stump, some Stones upon it, corner of L. L. Jones' Open field.
- 5th A Pine Stump, over the Meadow, over World's End Brook.
- 6th On another Stump, with Stones about it. —
- 7th A Pine Tree marked, in or near Hayner's land.
- 8th A White Oak tree, in the Line, between Mayner, & Amos Wood. —
- 9th A Stump of Stones, in the Wall, between Browns & Dakins land. —
- 10th A Statue of Stones, in Dea^r Dakins land, near Sudbury Road. —
- 11th A Pine Stump, in Dakins land, on a sknowl. —
- 12th Across Marlboro's Road, to a Statue of Stones, in the Woods west of a Pond Hole. —
- 13th A Stump of Stones, corner of Moses Maynard's Land. —
- 14th Heap of Stones, & Pine Tree, corner of Sudbury New Grant, west of a Deer Pond. —
- 15th A Stump, in Lieut. Maynard's field. —
- 16th An old Stump of Stones, west of L. L. Maynard. —
- 17th A Black Oak, marked. —
- 18th A Statue of Stones, Aston Corner. —
