Also some acres of upland to the same more or less lying on the
north side of the river between the lande of John Parmenter Junior
and the lande of Richard Alton.

Also one acre and a halfe of meadow to the same more or less lying
in the great river meadow betwixt the meadow of Thomas Alport
and Edmund Kirk.

Granted to John Maynard one acre of upland part of from his
house lott by the hight way, lying between the land of John Moore and
Robert Darvill, also a half an acre of upland adjoining to the east end
of the same house lott of upland as the said John Maynard bought of
Robert Darvill.

Granted to John Maynard 3 acres 3 furlongs of meadow lying in a field of meadow
just goes out of the gate towards common bound of his house lott and meadow of
Nathaniel Trowday & Richard Newton. this is John Maynard 3 furlongs of meadow

Granted to John Maynard four acres of upland lying upon a piece of land
adjoining to his land formerly granted to Thomas Allen now in the possession
of William Trowday & his wife more to the land of Robert Darvill being part
of John Maynard's former division of upland.

Also granted to John Maynard three acres of meadow lying in a field of meadow
lying between the meadow of John Goodenow & the meadow first granted
to him of Edward & now in the possession of Edmund Goodenow. lying on the
north side of the golf brook from the brook to the upland.

Also granted and layd out to John Maynard in the year 1658 one
hundred and thirty acres of land be it more or less in the two miles
of land last granted the town of Sudbury being by two and twentieth
lot and lying in the second squadron of lots having the land of Doron
taken government on the south and the lands of Robert Darvill on the
north being bounded at the east end by a hight way hight road
wide adjoining to the five miles of land first granted by
town of Sudbury and bounded at the west end by our middle
hight way adjoining to our third squadron of lots.
