

Record of the land of Zachariah Maynard

By order of the Proprietors a Committee Chosen to lay out forty acres
of land for Zachariah Maynard accordingly April first 1703 layd
the same out as followeth Beginninge at a whit oak Neare the
Nor West Corner of his house and from thence upon Thomas Plymton
lynne twenty six Rods to a whit oak tree: from thence down
down his ditch to a greene whit oak tree from thence to a
pine tree from thence to a Stake thes three lines beinge fifty
Rods Then Turning the angle Northwely Sixty four Rods to a
Black oak Tree: from thence Westwely forty four Rods to the
place where wood began: likewise another piece of land beginning
on the North side the Cart way that leads to the Gulph beginning
At a whit oak tree Running a straight line Eastward ninety four
Rods to a whit oak tree from thence a straight line Northwely to a
pine tree forty Rods: from thence a straight line Westwely seventy three
Rods: to a Black oak: from thence Southwely twenty three Rods
to a whit oak tree: from thence to the place where wood began
forty Rods the other small parcell of land joining to his owne
Meadow: beginning at a black oak neare the path Running Easterly
twenty seven Rods to a black oak: from thence twelue Rods to a pine
from thence thence twenty seven Rods to a pine: from thence to the
place where wood began twelue Rods: Surveyed by Mr 1703
