We It is remembered that on the twenty fourth
 Day of May in the year of our Lord 1821 --
 We the Subscribers perambulated the line between
 the Towns of Sudbury & Framingham and renewed
 the following boundaries (viz) 1st beginning at the River
 below the New Bridge so called at a stake & stones
 near a Maple tree Mark 1 2nd thence westerly to a stake
 & stones on land of Jonas Hills 3rd thence westerly to
 a stake & stones at the Road 4th to a stake & stones at a
 large stump on land of Hopstill Brown 5th to a stake
 & stones near Barrows Hills 6th to a stake & stones on
 top of a small Hill 7th to a white oak tree on land of
 John Eaton 8th to a stake & stones a maple stump
 on land of said Eaton 9th to a stake & stones in a stump
 on the top of the Hill west of John Eaton 10th to a white oak
 tree on land of John Brown 11th to a small maple on
 land of said Brown 12th to a stake & stones on ^{top of} descent
 hill 13th to a Chestnut tree on land of Adams Howe
 14th to a Chestnut tree on land of David Howe
 15th to a stake & stones in an Ash stump on land of
 David Howe 16th to an Oak tree on land of Adams
 Howe 17th to a stake & stones near a small pond
 18th to a Black Birch tree on land of Joshua Parmenter
 19th to a Gray Oak tree on land of Buckley Haile 20th to an
 upright stone the Northwest corner of Framingham
