

Sudbury May 22nd 1798

At a meeting of the Selectmen, of Sudbury, Laid out a Town Road by consent of Lt. Israel Smith, through said Smiths Charn, Dojoining to How, two Rod wide, said Road begins at the Town Line, in the Middle of the River, Near Mr. Benjⁿ Smiths Saw Mill where the Bridge Now stands: thence runs South Easterly where the Path is Now trod till it comes to a Town Road Leading by Mr. Jon^a Smiths to the Meeting House - all the trees standing on the aforesaid Road are hereby Reserved for the use & Benefit of the aforesaid Israel Smiths -

The Above Town Road was Accepted of, by the Town, at a Town Meeting, held in Sudbury, June the 18th 1798.

Sudbury April 22nd 1799

We the Subscribers, have at the request of Capt Jon^a Berth Laid out a Town road Beginning at a stake & stones, Between the Land of the aforesaid Berth & Asahel Hornmar of Concord - thence a North Easterly Course about 36 Rods to a stake & stones, thence to a pitch pine Marked about 24 Rods thence the same course, to a stake & stones in the Line Between Sudbury & Concord, the aforesaid road is two Rods Wide and the Marks are all on the East side of said Road -

The selectmen also report, that the aforesaid Asahel Hornmar, is hereby allowed the sum of forty five Dollars, in full of Damages, for the aforesaid Road, passing through his land,
