The Selectmen of Sudbury, at the desire of Capt. Jon^l. Burt & a Number of other Inhabitants of Sudbury & Concord, have laid out a Town way, or road, in manner following, Viz. Beginning at the end of a Town way, or road Near a Brook, called Cold Brook, not far from the aforesaid Burt's House, said Road runs North Easterly, through Land of the aforesaid Burt, aboute eighty Rods, till it comes to Land of Asahel Hornam, thence through said Hornam Land a North Easterly Course, till it comes to Land of Phineas Wheeler, thence continuing the same Course, through said Wheeler Land till it comes to a road Laid out, in the Town of Concord, the aforesaid Road is to be two rods wide, — The Conditions of Laying out the aforesaid road, is that the Town of Sudbury are not to be at any Expence for the purchase of Land, for the aforesaid road,
