or thereabouts, lying between the corpse cloths of Edward noyed & Walter
Shane.

Next for on land of upland formerly George munnings lying between
the lands of Bryan Pendleton & Walter Hume.

the four acres of meadows lying on the west side of the River in
the great meadows between the meadow of Mr Edmund Browne & Walter
Lamo.

Also found Nod of middow lying on the west side of the River in the great
meadows between the meadows of Walter Ham on both sides of it.

18(3) 1649. James Pondleton of Sudbury groweth unto Thomas King of the same our
 monument or house w^{ch} he bought lying between the brook that goeth
 from the pond into the river, & the house first groweth to Thomas King;
 beinge James Pondleton's house or house about in the second division of
 the land lying on the east side of the great river meadow between the
 lands of Mr. Walter Laine & George Manning: about the house and
 garden of meadow were to the bridge upon the great river meadow, be-
 inge between the meadows of Mr. Edmund Browne & John Blane-
 ford, w^{ch} all right & remedy to the said meadow belonging: And found
 that of meadow due to be laid out for Bryan Pondleton in water
 for his bound. And this was by an absolute deed of sale dated
 June the 10th 1649.

1646. December the 14th It is agreed between Walter Haine of Sudbury & Thomas King yt the said Walter Haine shal for ever posses & enjoy four acres of Meadow lying on the west side of ye river in ye great river Meadow lying between the Meadows of ye said Walter Haine: & yt the said Thomas King shal for ever posses & enjoy a peell of Meadow containing by estimation 4 acres lying on ye East side of ye river between ye Meadow of Mr. Walsgrave & ye river, wch peell of Meadow was formerly granted to ye said Walter Haine as part of his first division of Meadow: Witness Hugh Griffith.

These two acres of meadows lying in a piece of meadows that goes out of the
gulph towards Convent Boute next adjoining to the meadows of John of Dunmow
Junior being parts of the third division of meadows first granted to George
Mumfords six parts of the land that Mr. Rogers sold to Thomas King

Granted to Thomas Kinge three acres of meadows for y^e in conse-
deration of a bridge way taken out of his meadows by the bridge
waye bought of Hamet y^e Pondleton, w^{ch} three acres of meadows
lye now to Pantor meadows buttinge southerly & westerly
to the meadows of John Haynes & Northerly to the meadows of
John Groat.

Also granted and layd out unto Thomas Kings in the year 1653 in the two
miles of land last granted the Town of Sudbury one hundred and thirty acres of
land to it more or less having the lands of John Farmington Senior on the north
and the one hundred and thirty acres of land reserved for ason upon
on the south being the fifth lot and lyeth in the south west squadron
being ^{bounded} at the west end by the wilderness and bounded at the east end
by the middle river way joining to the first squadron
