

(7) 1642: Fogen moore bought of Edmund Rive of Sudbury the house of the said Edmund Rive w^{ch} his house lott containing by estimation four Acres or there about be the same more or lesse lying between the house lott of Fogen howe & the house lott of Henry Rive & now in the possession of the said Fogen moore: w^{ch} one acre & a halfe of vyland parted from the house lott by the right way leading to the common swamp on the one side, & the land of Henry Rive now in the possession of the said Fogen moore on the other side.

Also the house of vyland lying upon the plaines.
Also the house of vyland of vyland lying on the west side of the River, & lyeth on the south side of the meadow of Bryan Penelton be the same more or lesse adjoining to the land of Fogen howe.

Also the house of a halfe of meadow be the same more or lesse lying in the great River meadows between the meadow of Fogen howe & Fogen maynard.

Also the house of meadow be the same more or lesse lying in the great River meadow, between the meadow of Walter Lane & Fogen freeman.

Also the said Fogen moore bought all house right & privilege belonging or in any wise appertaining to the said house & for all partolls of lands, w^{ch} all further divisions of land to be laid out according to that proportion of land before mentioned.

Also the said Fogen moore bought of Henry Rive his house w^{ch} the house lott w^{ch} he purchased be the same more or lesse lying between the house lott of Fogen maynard & the house lott of Edmund Rive & now in the possession of the said Fogen moore.

Also one house & a halfe of vyland lying between the land of Fogen maynard & the land of Edmund Rive now in the possession of the said Fogen moore, & is parted from the house lott by the right way.

13(3) 1644. It is agreed between Edmund Rive Fogen Moore & Fogen howe that whereas Edmund Rive had formerly granted to Fogen howe house of vyland & house of the house of the w^{ch} ward, & Fogen Moore had then house of vyland lying upon the plaines, & Fogen howe had right house formerly granted to him on the west side of the River, the parties said by a joint consent agreed & agreed that it is to say from this day the said Fogen Moore shall possess & enjoy the right house of vyland formerly granted to Fogen howe, & Fogen howe shall possess & enjoy the right house formerly granted to Edmund Rive & also the house of vyland of the house of vyland lying upon the plaines w^{ch} the house of vyland w^{ch} the land of Edmund Rive now; & the said Edmund Rive shall possess & enjoy the right house of vyland lying upon the plaines w^{ch} the said Edmund Rive formerly sold to the said Fogen Moore.

1645. Fogen Moore bought of Fogen howe his dwelling house & house lott & all other lands & moor & wood belonging to the said Fogen howe or that he or his father had or had not the said Fogen howe by virtue of his first right in the beginning of the plantation of Sudbury. And also all the houses that are now standing about the part of the said land & all the houses & fields that are now and about the house w^{ch} he or his father had or had not belonging to the said house.

646. 126. Granted to John Moore 12 acres of vyland lying upon concord path more by land of the which being pt of the land, w^{ch} John Moore had bought of John Stone the 2 acres of meadow lying in the pasture meadow between the meadow of William Killy & John Bent the 2 acres of meadow lying in the south pt of the house ground in a field by it self. Also 1 acre of meadow lying on the west side between the meadow of Mr. William Stone & Henry Rive. Also 3 acres of meadow lying on the west side between the meadow of Thomas White & Walter Rive w^{ch} the 12 acres of meadow are for all the same for a 3^d Division of meadow.
