Ego lands of Widow Walsbrook

Ego lands formerly granted to Thomas Walsbrook & now in the possession of Sarah Walsbrook widow laid out at the town's appointment by ^{Bryan} ~~Walsbrook~~ ^{Walsbrook} & Edmund Goodnow the 23. of Octob. 1643. Ego lands lying about the mill house containing by estimation thirty two Acres of upland or thereabouts to the same more or less, having a good way on every side of it, & also all the parcell of meadow lying within the said lands to the same more or less. Also one parcell of meadow containing by estimation ^{three} ~~four~~ Acres or thereabouts, to the same more or less, lying on the south side of the clay pit & brick kiln.

Also eight Acres of upland to the same more or less lying on the east side of the forsook meadow & built upon the same plains on the east side of it, all the Cranberry Swamp adjoining to it, joining to the land of Robert Davids. ^{Also 30 Acres of meadow lying in west meadows on the north side of the} ~~Also 30 Acres of meadow lying in west meadows on the north side of the~~ Granted to Sarah Walsbrook widow forty Acres of upland lying on the south side of the town's bound, joining to the east side of the lands of Thomas Goodnow due to Thomas Walsbrook by a former grant.

January the 14. 1651 granted to John Grouth six Acres of meadows in full satisfaction for all wrongs formerly committed by our warden his men and for defect of his meadows formerly granted to Sir John Walsbrook. And this six Acres lies in a parcell of meadows between Pauline meadows of Dunsdell joining south west to the meadows of Thomas King & North east good neere to the lower end of Dunsdell.

Also granted and laid out to John Grouth in the year 1651 one hundred and thirty Acres of land and meadow in the two miles of land last granted to the town of Sudbury, which lay one hundred and thirty Acres of land and meadow lying in the fourth and fifth west square and is the two and forty lot and forty on the north to the lands of John Woodward and forty on the south to the lands of John Bout junior and butley on the west upon the wilderness and butley on the east upon the middle of the way (which is the north and first square)
